

Citrus (syn. Fortunella) microcarpa 'Calamondin'



CALAMANSI, PHILLIPPINE LIME, CALAMONDIN KUMQUAT / CUMQUAT

Calamondin is considered a cross between mandarin and cumquat. As a tree, it has glossy deep-green leaves and grows between 3-6m tall. The fruit resembles a small, round lime, orange in colour when fully ripe and is great for cooking, in spices, jams, marmalades and preserves.

As a fruiting tree it is suitable planted in multiples or as a single specimen in a garden or landscape. Great for pots on decks and terraces. Widely cultivated for both its ornamental qualities and its fruit. The plant is well-regarded for its masses of fragrant white flowers and its small, round, orange fruits that are tart in flavour.

This variety requires a position in full sun in a humus rich, well-drained soil. They are quite hungry so feed well and do not over water.
