Description	<p>This is a hardy, low and wide-spreading, deciduous, ornamental tree with a lovely weeping habit. It bears deep red buds and rosy-red flowers in spring which turn to purplish-red small fruits. It makes a knock-out specimen tree in a small landscape.</p>
