<b>Description</b>	This deciduous tree is often overlooked in favour of other forms of Photinia. Great for hedging, it is a compact tree suitable for low screens or planted as a feature specimen. It has purple-brown new growth and good autumnal colour. Panicles of white flowers are produced in spring.
