











Tree	 <p>Prunus armeniaca 'Storey' STOREY APRICOT</p>
Description	<p>This variety produces large, golden fruit with some red blush. Flesh is deep yellow and firm. 'Storey' is actually a fast-growing, early-fruiting version of the Moorpark Apricot.</p>
Foliage	<p> Deciduous</p>
Form	<p> Round</p>
Mature Size	<p>3 x 3m</p>
Uses	<p>As a high-to-medium chill hour variety, this variety is not suited for tropical or sub-tropical areas. Storey apricots are known for good flavour and is typically used for jams, preserving and drying.</p>
Position & Soil	<p>Plant in a sunny position with well-drained soil. Keep soil moist until the tree is established. Fertilise and prune every year to encourage new growth and fruit the following year.</p>
