During the warmer months, white fluffy blossom are borne, followed by fleshy red berries.</p>	<p>This Lilly Pilly is a better form than the narrow growing 'Pinnacle' due to its dense foliage and naturally columnar form. Foliage is a mid-green colour and fruits are reddish-pink. As the name suggests it is a great selection for narrow spaces.</p>

Would also be ideal along tight driveways and along fences if you require a little height. This variety could easily be used as an Australian native alternative to the Italian pencil pines. The berries can be used for jams, and infusing gin etc, but are recommended to be eaten raw.</p>
